Called to pack Shoeboxes

For most families Operation Christmas Child means packing a few boxes in November and bringing them to church. For my family it means a whole lot more.

It starts for us in January. Every time she goes shopping Karen looks for bargain shoe box items and starts collecting them. Through out the year she is busy knitting washcloths, making beaded jewelry and copying and assembling coloring books. This year she added making toy tops for all 200 boxes. Karen pours her soul into every item she makes. She wasn't happy with plain socks for the girls so she takes the time to sew beads around the top of each sock.

By June, our shed is full of items for 200 or so shoeboxes. At that point she starts bringing everything into the house a little at a time for organizing and inventory. A lot of time is put into this process as well. Each bar of soap is put in a zip lock bag, counted and put away. This year Karen made a good portion of the soap bars from blocks of soap left over from other projects. The candies are all sorted, counted and put in zip bags as well. She takes the socks and underwear and elastic bands them together by sex and sizes. And on and on and on.

By November all items are ready to go, the boxes themselves are folded and labeled, and everything is taken to the Church and spread out on to two rows of tables for the packing party.

Some people are called to preach, and others to teach. Karen has been called to pack shoe boxes.

In CCLI's first ever report period, October 1988 to March 1989, "Give Thanks" was #4 in the list of CCLI Top Songs. Throughout the 1990's it remained in the CCLI Top 10, and it was the #1 song in the Fall-Winter period of 1994. In every report period since, "Give Thanks" has been in the CCLI Top 150 songs, and in each Fall-Winter report period, it has remained within or very near the CCLI Top 50.

We recently discovered a YouTube video of Henry and his wife Cindy singing their signature song. Enjoy it, and have a Blessed Thanksgiving from CCLI.

Our church has certainly made use of this great song of thanks to our God. We first used it in 2008 and have used it at Thanksgiving time every year since. In my opinion the words of this song expresses what we, as Christians, should be thankful for.
