## It's Shoebox Time Again!

In less than three weeks, on October 18th, we will be kicking off our annual Operation Christmas Child Shoebox drive. This will be my 13th year of leading this missions outreach for our church and I am more excited than ever to see how God will be exalted this season. I am constantly amazed and overwhelmed by how generous you are towards these children of His! Last year we exceeded our goal and sent out 349 shoebox missionaries to Nepal and the Philippines. Last year our church and Pre-school exceeded our goal by 30%!

We had a special donation of 50 boxes last year so I am setting our goal once again at 250 boxes and let's see what God can do through us.

Our shoebox packing party will be Saturday, November 14th at 1pm in the MPR. If you would like to donate items for the boxes please see our table in the Narthex for a complete list of items. We are in need of candy, (gum, hard candy, etc.) toiletry items, and money to help cover the shipping cost. Samaritan's Purse receives an average of only \$4.58 per box to cover the \$7 needed for shipping. If you chose to adopt a box (still a bargain at \$25) please be assured that your shipping costs are covered.

Please be in prayer for how God will work in our hearts for this mission, and that He will begin to soften the hearts of the children who will receive our boxes. Pray that they will receive the best present there is, and that is knowing Jesus Christ as their Savior.

I (Danielle) have a very sweet class of first graders this year! Both Ryan and I have been blessed by how diligent the students are at this school. This school has students from all over the world and of all different religious backgrounds and belief systems. We are blessed each day to be able to share the gospel and our lives with these students! At lunch time when we pray and thank God for our lunch, one Korean first grader said to me, "Mrs. Stauffer, can you teach me to pray?" Ummm, yes!! That's why I'm here! Ryan has also had some great conversations in secondary as he is developing good relationships with students there.

Spiritual Emphasis Week

This week is Spiritual Emphasis Week at school. It is sort of like Vacation Bible School each afternoon for all students K-12. This week we will be focusing on the story of the 5 missionary men, Jim Elliot, Nate Saint, Ed McCully, Peter Fleming and Roger Youderian, who were martyred in Ecuador while ministering to the Auca people in the rainforest. The cousin of Nate Saint will be the speaker for the week and each of the activities connects with the story of these missionaries which is directly tied to the gospel. Just as these men laid down their lives for the Auca people to hear the gospel of Christ, Jesus Christ died on the cross on our behalf that we might be united with God and become worshippers of Him.

## Sunday 9:00 Service what did we learn

Our last 9:00 am worship service will be conducted on Sunday September 27th. I thought it would be fun to look back and see what we did.

There have been early services off and on throughout our Church history mostly in the summer. Our latest run began on June 10<sup>th</sup> 2012. So a little over three years and 150 services latter, here we are. Attendance varied from 3 or 4 to over 25, and a lot of visitors came during that time.

The concept was that the early service would be a teaching service. Hymns were taught and sung, memory verses were introduced, and a sermon/lesson was provided.

The Primary speaker was Bod Daly. Bob led a series of messages on evangelism as well as walking us through the book of Romans. He started going through the Gospel of John and got as far as chapter 8.




Music was provided by myself and Pastor Paul with Audio/Visual support from Karen. I tried to mix both hymns and contemporary music. One of the things I did was a hymn study that lasted from January of 2013 through April of 2014. We looked at the history of hymns and hymn writers including 23 different hymn writers.

For memory verses I started with "The Navigators Topical Memory System" which included 72 verses. I consider these verses essential for believers to be familiar with. Following that we went through what I called "The Alphabet Verses." These are verses my kids learned in Kindergarten. There was one verse starting with each letter of the alphabet for a total of 26 verses. We finished with 36 verses on evangelism. (We got through all but 4) So all together we looked at 132 verses.

All in all I feel we accomplished our goal with this endeavor but the elders decided to shift emphasis to study classes and discipleship training. I personally will miss the old format but am also excited about the new one. I encourage everyone to come at 9:00 am starting Sunday October 4<sup>th</sup> and see what the Lord has planned for us.

## Missionary Prayers and Updates

**Mission Field in Transition**

We have been praying for future ministry for the Sigsby's and now the time and location has come. Beginning November 2, Kevin will be working with Sun Ministries in the Hyde Park area of St. Louis, Missouri. Kevin and Pam leave Vancouver October 21 and plan to arrive in St. Louis October 26.

The Hyde Park area is one of the more impoverished areas of St. Louis. Sun Ministries took shape about six years ago to train people to be missionaries who live on site for two years studying, working and living in ministry in the area. The ministry is also creating small businesses to provide hope to those living in the neighborhood. Thus far five small businesses have been created and there are currently 23 people employed from the neighborhood working alongside the missionary staff. By working alongside one another the goal is building trust and opportunity to share life in Christ.

One of the small businesses launched has been making café furniture, lovely wooden tables and chairs, suitable for a café or other small dining needs. Kevin has been hired to run the wood shop. This will entail maintaining production of all product lines, training new employees, and, hopefully, sharing life and spiritual skills with the employees. His official title will be Director of Woodshop and Rehab. In addition to the woodshop, the ministry currently has eleven buildings in the area in which they hope to launch additional businesses. When the woodshop production is caught up with current orders, Kevin will also assist with rehabbing some of those buildings.

And what will Pamela be doing? We're not sure at this point, but we are confident that she'll find meaningful opportunities of her own after they get settled a bit in their new locale.

## Alex-and-A Candy Cane A Shoe Box Story



A small candy cane brought a big smile to my face when I received a shoebox gift in an orphanage following the Rwandan genocide.

Imagine the excitement of 250 children in an orphanage who had never before received a gift, each holding shoeboxes from Operation Christmas Child. We were so curious. What was inside these boxes? Finally, there was a countdown and we opened the lid and looked inside! Kids began screaming left and right, not because they were sad but because of their joy to receive a gift for the very first time.

As I opened my shoebox I saw school supplies, hygiene items such as toothpaste and a toothbrush, socks, underwear, and a watercolor paint set. Some of these items were foreign to me. I looked at the paintbrush—I didn't know what it was. I looked at the paint—it was colorful but I didn't know what it was either. I looked at Smarties and wondered what they were. I thought they were medicine. Everything was new! Nearly all of my senses were being used. I was feeling, touching, smelling to figure out what it was.

One of my favorite items was discovered using my other sense—my sense of taste. I had no idea what it was when I ate this item with the plastic still on it. It was sweet. It was very *pepperminty*. It tasted like something I didn't expect. That was my first time eating a candy cane.

A hair comb was the item that I kept the longest. This wasn't a typical comb. When you opened it on one side there was a pick and by opening the other side with a twist, a brush would come out. I took this comb with me everywhere I went for the next three years.

Each and every item in that shoebox brought me joy at a time when I had lost all hope. I didn't see how Jesus Christ was working at that time, but an eternal seed was planted in my heart in that moment. A year later, I realized the many things God did in my life to bring me where I was.

My Mom passed away with AIDS when I was a very little boy. During the Rwandan genocide my grandmother and uncle were killed right in front of me. People argued about whether or not to kill my entire family. A bullet missed my head by an inch. We walked for miles and miles, sleeping in the bushes, the dirt, and abandoned buildings. In the end I was put in an orphanage.

That box gave me joy when there was nothing left. Something as small as a candy cane put a smile on my face even when I didn't know what it was. God used that moment to give me a glimpse of greater joy that is in Him.

In the years that followed, I wrestled a lot with “why?” Why am I alive? Why did God spare my life through the war? Why did God take away the people I loved?

Through the mentorship of people around me and through Jeremiah 29:11, I began to see that God had a plan for my life. I could look back and see the miracles since the day I was born. I could not ignore His presence in my life. One of those moments was receiving a shoebox right after the genocide.

A simple candy cane might seem small and insignificant but at that moment as a 7-year-old, I needed to be reminded that someone loved me, someone still cared. It was such a joyful moment I will never forget.
