"Lord, Grant us to Speak Your Word with All Boldness" Acts 4:1-32 January 3, 2020

Sermon Series- "Precarious Prayers for 2021"

Big Idea- When the world seeks to silence us, we must press forward with courage and pray for boldness to stay faithful to the end and not be silent.

Background- The apostles brought healing to a lame man through Jesus' name and were arrested to for their good deed by the religious authorities.

LESSON 1- In the midst of resistance, we must preach the <u>WORD</u>

- A. The word preached will always bear fruit to God's <u>PURPOSE</u> (Acts 4:1-4; Isaiah 55:11; **2 Corinthians 2:14-17**)
- B. The word preached is a reminder that salvation is only in <u>JESUS</u> (Acts 4:5-12; John 14:6; 1 Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 2:3)
- C. The word preached faithfully will meet worldly <u>RESISTANCE</u> (Acts 4:13-22; John 7:7; 15:18-19; 17:14; 1 John 2:15; James 4:4)
- D. The word preached trusts in God's sovereignty and Spirit <u>BOLDNESS</u> (Acts 4:23-32; Acts 1:8; Romans 8:31; Matthew 28:18-20)

Theological application-

- 1. Bold in not staying silent (4:1, 18-19)
- 2. Bold in our confidence in the Holy Spirit's leading (4:8)
- 3. Bold in our good deeds (4:9)
- 4. Bold in the exclusivity of Jesus (4:12)
- 5. Bold in God's power, not our ordinariness (4:13-14)
- 6. Bold in our obedience to God and not man (4:19-20)
- 7. Bold in the midst of threats to stay silent (4:17, 21, 29)
- 8. Bold in Unity (4:23, 32)
- 9. Bold in their understanding of God's sovereignty (4:27-28)
- 10. Bold in Prayer (4:24-31)

Bold person knows the risks, but presses forward anyway knowing it's worth it! (Hebrews 2:14; Revelation 2:10)

ESV Acts 5:40-41 and when they had called in the apostles, they beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. 41 Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name.
