- The carpet is a little different color than it was and matches perfectly with the floor, countertops, and chairs. We hope it will be more stain resistant as well.

Macedonia Missions to the Balkans Petre Petrov, Director

Please cont. praying for full recover from the virus for Marino, Vesna; Stojan, Lenka; Zlvko, Fani; Sasho, Renata; and Jonatan, Valentina and their families. No update on how they are doing.

MMB has a vision of 100 new churches planted all around Macedonia. Pray for the next generation of young leaders, for God's provision, wisdom, and guidance to fulfill their vision.

The new church in Kavadarci has 15-20 believers attending. Pray for the Community of Resen & Novo Selo that have established home groups will grow into official churches.

Even in the midst of a global pandemic, the church is active and alive. People are hearing the Gospel and our humanitarian work is growing. The best example of this is the Evangelical Church in Ve-

les. Besides regular services and activities, this church is meeting the needs of families in their community through compassion ministries. It currently provides



monthly food packages for 80 families and their soup kitchen that serves hot meals for 30 individuals each day.

The recent Alpha Course in Tetovo has 4-5 Muslim background Albanians attending as well as Macedonians. Pray that the Holy Spirit will soften their hearts and minds to the truths and hope the Gospel offers. Pray God saves them. (Alpha Course is evangelistic, introducing basic Christian faith through talks and discussion "an opportunity to explore the meaning of life")

Praise; the new church in Radovish has a building. Pray that Sunday services start soon.



Royal Rangers is for children in the EV churches. Pray as they learn from God's Word and honor Him going out to do service projects. Praise; the renovation of the church in Shtip (*Petre is pastor there*) is finished and now more than 100 people can worship together. They are thankful to those who have donated to this project!

Central Asian Family

February 24th was to be a soft opening of a 2nd sandwich shop location. This one is in partnership with a very well known gas station. We prayed for these negotiations and God has answered! The hope is that the new shop will be open 24 hours a day, 6 days a week. Pray for good new workers, God's favor, protection, strength, wisdom, and endurance. Pray for a financial breakthrough so that the shops may become profitable and debt free.

On March 8 the family plans to fly to the USA for the birth of E #3 son. Pray for the long journey and the three flights!

Pray that the workers are diligent and bold in their personal outreach and that ministries come along side Japanese brethren in equipping them form effective outreach.

Pray for the Lord's blessing on their Japanese language evangelism training launching this year.

Life Choices Pregnancy Clinic North Carson, Nevada

Pray for the volunteer advocates meeting with clients to be discerning in what to say and how to guide. Ask the Holy Spirit to help them to be good listeners to their client's needs, fears, and concerns.

J.O. in Ethiopia

Praise the Lord that J's His health has improved. Thank you for praying! He has been out to eat with students and has had great conversations.

The search for a new location for the school is still underway. Pray for a possible grant to come in which would help with start-up costs.

The women on the team have started a yoga class. Another avenue for evangelism.

A man J has been walking with has a heart for orphans and sex workers, and desires to start a non-profit in Kenya. Pray for God's provision, guidance, and a future for this kind of ministry there.

Continue praying for conversations about Christ with the students who come to learn English. Pray that the Bible is open and that they read the truths for themselves. J currently has two students he has been talking with about the Good News.

FMI, Pastor W. in Pakistan

In early March a team will travel to a province in Pakistan previously unvisited by any of our American staff. It is an especially dangerous region. (special government permission is required and military troops will accompany them.) Intercede for safety, good rapport with military, clarity in the visits, and divine superintendence of activities.

Bibles continue to be given out in the countries FMI partners with. Pray for boldness to share God's Word. Intercede for recipients of the Scriptures – to read, understand, and obey its message and to place their faith in Jesus Christ.

Pray that the virus is more controllable so that believers can continue to worship together.

Pray for those who are fearful. Pray that they trust the Lord's Sovereignty, power, and goodness and encourage others to do the same.

Pastor W. travels much. Pray for good health, physical strength, and joy as our Lord's servant. Continue praying for the brick kiln families. Intercede that God makes time for them to pray and if they have a Bible, time to read and know that God loves them.

A recent story from the Sandwich Shop (From J & H in Central Asia)

"One of our workers grew up in an orphanage. He has cerebral palsy and is a very hard worker. Last week during his shift a young lady came in to order a sandwich. She too grew up in the same orphanage as our worker and came to believe through our worker's foster parents. When they saw each other they embraced and cried. It was truly a family reunion!

We have been hearing testimonies of how the sandwich shop is touching people's lives. This week we were asked to cater sandwiches for a fund raiser for a little girl with muscular dystrophy. The money raised went to help pay for her extremely expensive medicine. We were thankful to be asked to be a part of this fundraiser and to continue to support and love those with special needs."



Church Membership

In February's newsletter, Mondo

wrote an article about church membership. I thought it would be beneficial this month to include the section from our church by-laws about Church Membership.

ARTICLE V Church Membership Section 1. Purpose of the Fellowship

The congregation of Christian believers who have applied for membership and have been duly accepted shall constitute a spiritual body, united for the spiritual purposes set forth in Article II of these Bylaws.

Section 2. Active Membership

Active membership in the Tahoe Community Church of Stateline, NV shall be open to all persons who: 1) confess Christ as their Lord and Savior and 2) who have been baptized; in this sequential order. According to the pattern demonstrated in Scripture, baptism shall be by immersion unless there are extenuating circumstances prohibiting immersion. Active membership is open to those who are seasonal residents in the local area. This section of the bylaws shall allow for dual membership at TCC and the other church fellowship during the off season.

Section 3. Voting Privileges

Membership in this church shall not vest in any member any proprietary rights in the Church, but shall only entitle the member to vote at a meeting of the members on those matters that the Board of Elders chooses to submit to the church membership for affirmation. In such cases, voting privileges are restricted to members who are in good standing, who are not under any disciplinary action, and who have passed their 18th birthday. Membership shall not be assignable inter vivos by any member nor shall membership vest to any personal representative, heir, or devisee (i.e. no proxies).

Section 4. Applications for Membership

All requests for membership shall be made to a Pastor, Elder, or Deacon. Upon making such a request, the person shall be given an application for membership, along with a copy of these Bylaws (including Appendix 1 Doctrinal Statement). The applicant shall be offered to attend a membership class if a class is offered at that time. Each applicant shall assent and subscribe to the Bylaws and the What We Teach Statement, and meet with the Elders privately. If there is any disagreement with the Bylaws

or doctrinal statement, it must be made in writing to the Elders during their meeting.

Section 5. Denial or Removal of Membership

If, upon review of an application for membership or after meeting with a prospective member, the Board of Elders determines that the applicant does not confess Jesus Christ as his or her Lord and Savior, or that there is a lack of evidence of a godly lifestyle, membership shall be denied. The decision made by the Board of Elders shall be final and there shall be no appeal to any court from that decision. The Board of Elders reserves the right to revisit an application at any time.

Separate and apart from the process of church discipline, but subject to the discretion and approval of the elders, the names of any members who have not attended a worship service, Sunday School class session or Fellowship Group meeting at Tahoe Community Church for a period of three months or longer may be removed from the membership rolls.

Section 6. Admission of Applicants

Applicants admitted to membership shall, if possible, present themselves at a worship service designated by the Pastor-Teacher and Board of Elders, at which service such applicants shall publicly affirm their membership commitment and be publicly acknowledged as members.

Section 7. Responsibilities of Members

Members shall seek to exercise their spiritual gifts for the mutual benefit of all the church body and shall submit to the loving rule of the Elders while demonstrating a recognition of accountability to the local church (e.g. Matt 18:18). Listed below are some of the responsibilities of those who join themselves as members to this local body.

- (a) **Serving** God has given each member of Tahoe Community Church a giftedness to be used (1 Peter 4:10). This may include teaching, visiting the sick, serving in the various ministries, singing on the worship team, maintaining the physical building and its property, or working in committees, etc. We do feel that all have a responsibility to the Lord Himself to be faithful stewards of the gift that He has entrusted to them.
- (b) **Learning -** Members of Tahoe Community Church must first develop a growing faith, learning more about the character of God, and be able to articulate it by participating in Bible study groups and by developing the habit of daily Bible study (2 Timothy 2:15; 1 Peter 3:15; Matt 4:4).

(c) **Giving -** Members of Tahoe Community Church are expected to give as God

has purposed in their heart to help support the ministry that God is doing in this community. Members should give freely and cheerfully understanding that they are simply stewards of God's resources (2 Cor. 9:8-9; 1 Cor. 16:2).

- (d) **Witnessing -** "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:8). At the same time that Jesus commissioned His disciples, He set forth our responsibility to spread the Gospel everywhere (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15). This means members are called to be an effective witness to friends, neighbors, co-workers, and family members.
- (e) **Praying -** Each member should have a practice of consistent prayer (1 Thess. 5:17), being persistent in requests, aligning petitions with God's will for his/her life and the life of the Church and its leaders (1 Timothy 2:1-2; 1 Peter 4:7).
- (f) **Worshiping** Tahoe Community Church is set in the South Shore community to shine as a lighthouse for Jesus Christ and will shine as long as its members remain faithful in the matter of public worship (Matt. 5:16; Rev. 2:5). The Lord is glorified when believers consistently participate in the ordinance of the Lord's supper (communion).
- (g) Relationship with other members Members should realize that we are a body of believers (1 Cor. 12). Members are encouraged to try to get to know other members they don't know and be united for the cause of our Lord Jesus Christ. The members are to love and build up other members, to come along-side those that are not members, as well as sharing with others who are less fortunate (Eph. 4:13; Heb. 10:25; James 1:27). Recognizing that we are a community church made up of a diversity of spiritual backgrounds, we affirm the following statement: In essentials, unity; In non-essentials, liberty; In all things, charity (love).


