"How To Resist the Attacks on Jesus' Sufficiency" 4/18/21 Colossians 2:16-23

Studies in Colossians- "The Supremacy and Sufficiency of Jesus the Messiah"

"And you are <u>complete</u> in Him, who is the head of all principality and power." Colossians 2:10

<u>Complete</u>: having all parts or elements; lacking nothing; whole; entire; full; having all required or customary characteristics, skills, or the like.

LESSON 1- To resist these attacks we must realize the failure of <u>LEGALISM</u>

Legalism- the teaching that salvation or sanctification is enhanced through man-made rules or works.

A. Legalism fails because Jesus is the <u>SUBSTANCE</u> (1 Tim 4:3-5; Mark 7:19; Gal 4:9-11; **Rom 14:14-20**; Acts 15:28-29)

"Do not tear down the work of God for the sake of food. All things indeed are clean, but they are evil for the man who eats and gives offense." (Rom 14:20)

Discipleship A disciple will trust in Jesus alone and also not look down on on another believer in grey areas!

LESSON 2- To resist these attacks we must realize the failure of <u>MYSTICISM</u> **Mysticism-** the teaching that communion with God comes through direct contact with Him or through some other intermediary apart from Jesus Christ (angels, **Mary**, etc.).

A. Mysticism fails because Jesus is the <u>HEAD</u> of the body. (1 Tim 2:5; John 14:6; Acts 4:12; Matt 4:10; Rev 19:10; 22:9; Heb 1:1-2)

Discipleship A disciple will not be distracted with some secret pathway, but **Response** trust in Jesus alone!

LESSON 3- To resist these attacks we must realize the failure of <u>ASCETICISM</u> **Aseticism-** the teaching that a person can attain a high spiritual and moral state by practicing self-denial, self-mortification and other self-imposed disciplines.

A. Asceticism fails because its rules perish and are <u>POWERLESS</u> (Gal 4:3; 9-12; 1 Tim 4:1-3; 1 Cor 6:13; Romans 13:14; John 8:32-36)

"But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts." (Rom 13:14)

Discipleship A disciple will recognize that their completeness is in Jesus alone! **Response**
