At this time, we are revising the Church Profile that was used in 2016/2017 when the Lord called Mondo to be our pastor. The Committee has been going through this docu-

ment line by line to update, correct and make slight additions to its wording. Mondo has been of great assistance in revising parts of this document, especially items having to do with our church theology and the pastor duties. The Committee is consolidating some of the steps used in the last pastor search, so it is possible it will not take us the eight months of our last search to find the candidate the Lord has for us. God's timing in this!

The following is a summary of how the Committee will conduct this search:

The Committee hopes to be able to post the job posting on various websites, where possible candidates typically search for positions as a pastor, in early May. As responses come in from these postings, the Committee will review each resume and any other information sent by the candidate. As the candidates are narrowed down, the Committee will send further questions which may or may not lead to Zoom interviews. The Committee, after 100% agreement, and with the approval of the Elders, will give you information on the candidate who will be invited to Tahoe Community Church so you have the chance to get to know him and for him to preach.

The Members of Tahoe Community Church will vote 'yes' or 'no' on this candidate as our new pastor. Per our church bi-laws, only members are allowed to vote.

You should know and understand that this Committee is unified in the Lord and led by the Lord in each and every step we take. Our new pastor will be called by the Lord – His will, not the Committee's.

All Information of this Pastor Search is confidential and as members of this Committee, we will not share details with you. Kathy Pavich as Chairperson, will try to keep the Body of TCC updated on the progress of the Committee. You are welcome to express your thoughts and questions to Kathy Pavich or other committee members on what our next pastor may be like, but again remember that the Committee will be listening for God's direction.

The Pastor Search Committee is asking for your prayers. Please pray for God's will in everything we do, open hearts and minds, discernment, and unity in Christ. His will be done, not ours!

Restoration Continues

- Counter tops need to be installed
- Baseboards and some trimming need to be put in
- The half wall from the front door to Sarah's office is framed but needs to be drywalled
- Ceiling tiles need to be put in
- The window to the new crib room needs to be put in and framed.

We are pushing our contractor to have the project finished in about two weeks. The next step will be to move Sarah's office items back in and empty and get rid of the Pods. After that, we can

refurbish the rest of the room and get ready to welcome our kids back into their new classroom!

Post Vaccination Scams

The Safety Team would like to provide the following information for your situational awareness. As

stated previously, TCC makes no recommendation about personal healthcare decisions involving Covid-19. That said, for those who choose to get vaccinated, the following is important information.

The FBI is warning people about a new scam targeting people who have received a COVID-19 vaccine. An increasing number of those vaccinated are being asked via email and/or text message to participate in a fraudulent post-vaccine survey. If they participate, they are promised "a prize or cash". Neither Pfizer™, Moderna™ nor Johnson & Johnson™ are conducting post-vaccination surveys. The FBI says any emails or text messages that appear to be sent from these companies seeking financial info are fraudulent.

The Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General (HHS-OIG), and the FBI recently published a Public Service Announcement regarding fake COVID vaccination card scams as well. Since the beginning of COVID-19, there have been numerous scams identified seeking to capitalize off public panic and unsuspecting individuals, including the elderly. These scams have unanimously been aimed at seeking to collect personal identification information and are identified as financial fraud schemes. The FBI urges vigilance during the pandemic and has multiple tactics to avoid being defrauded. Signs of potential scams include:

- You are asked to pay out of pocket to get the vaccine.
- You are asked to pay to put your name on vaccine waiting lists or to get early access.
- Advertisements for vaccines through social media platforms, email, telephone calls, online, or from unsolicited/unknown sources.
- Marketers offering to sell or ship doses of the vaccine for payment.

Protect yourself! Do not give out your personal information to unknown sources.

In April, Macedonia was under a new wave of the Corona virus. Pray for the evangelistic work the brethren desire to do in several communities there. Pray for how our Lord will get the Good News out to people whose hearts are prepared to hear.

Recently the church in Skopje completed training for new Sunday School Teachers that will work with children and teens. Pray for the restart of regular services there.

The believers of Prelip church to the Gypsy people went outside, on the streets, and in the market place in the city. They gave out Christian booklets, and seeds for planting to the people they met. They were able to start conversations with many of them and to share about their hope in Christ.

Pastor Dragan doing pioneer work in Resen, is trying to reach new families and villages. They visited three schools and gave Christmas Shoeboxes to every child. They also received New Testaments and Christian booklets.

Pray for a new online project in Gevgelija, in cooperation with Sarang Church from South Korea. Included is English and Korean Cooking, Computer, and Instrument learning instructions for children ages 12-17 years old.

Their biggest need and challenge right now is financial support. Every month is a new battle. They don't know if some of the pastors, leaders, and families will have something to put on the table. Pray for God's provision for His servants.

Central Asian Family

J., H. and family arrived safely in North Dakota in mid April. What a joy it was to have them visit us here in Tahoe for a month! We were even blessed with a wonderful time of sharing one Sunday.

Pray as they get in contact with a midwife, health for H. and baby boy E's arrival at the end of May.

Pray the boys E & E adjust to being with another part of their family, and grow in grace and knowledge of the Lord from instruction and example provided by their parents.

Tim & Susan Driscoll, Japan

Thank you for praying for the recent training. Participants gained more focus on ministry activities to reach their vision, mission, values, goals, strategies and action steps. It was tiring as they continued to fulfill their regular ministry roles at the same time. Pray for the workers to serve with new vitality and encouragement from the Lord.

Workers aren't currently able to go to Japan due to Covid restrictions. Because of that, "Journey Through Japan" will launch May 8th through two zoom calls. Pray God uses it to build His Kingdom and that workers and prayer would be mobilized.

They have added the role of care-taker for one of the ministry's owned holiday homes. It is a three hour drive from where they live. These homes are used by missionaries for rest and retreats. Pray they have humble, servant-hearts as they do what is needed.

Over Easter they shared tracts and homemade bread with neighbors, Mrs. Ito and Mrs. Uehara. Pray the Holy Spirit enters their hearts. Also, Yui, whom Tim disciples over zoom, has returned to Japan for college. Pray her faith is sure and unshakeable.

Pray for God's wisdom for a difficult situation with a few of their workers. Pray for good relationships and opportunities to serve and be influential with the small Baptist Church they are attending.

Life Choices Pregnancy Clinic North Carson, Nevada

When a client chooses life for her baby, the next way she can be encourage and informed is by signing up for the clinics parenting classes. These classes provide opportunity for the relationship between advocates and clients to grow, and more opportunities to share Gospel truths.

The clinic has slated Friday, September 24, 2021 for their annual Fundraiser Gala. Pray for the preparations and planning. Information about the Gala will be released early this summer.

J.O. in Ethiopia

J. is blessed to be meeting new people all the time. Pray the Holy Spirit is putting people with open hearts in J's path. Pray for relationships to grow and opportunities to share Good News with them and that they will ask questions he can answer with Truth.

Language study, and teaching English as a second language to students, continues. This is J's main focus. Pray for how the Good News is incorporated into this work and God gives the words in the responses each teacher can give. Pray for unity with J's team.

There is still no word on the grant they are waiting for. Pray for God's wisdom in the choices that are being made.

Pastor W. in Pakistan

Ask for God's favor on all FMI pastors as they aim to make disciples, not simply converts. There are several pastors in Pakistan, and FMI also has pastors and workers in Indonesia, Bangladesh, and Kenya.

Continue praying for whom God will provide to take Pastor W's place for future ministry. There is no urgent request, but it is always good to pray for preparation as Pastor W. is getting older.

Pray for the team that was supposed to travel to a dangerous area of Pakistan to scout out a new area for ministry. There is no word on the outcome of this trip but we trust God is in the work, guiding and leading.

We rejoice with Nadimah, one of the leaders in the Women's Discipleship Initiative. The ministry flourishes and grows! Many younger females are being raised up to engage in evangelism and discipleship.

Pray for a revival to sweep among the women of Pakistan.

Pray for ministry leaders when they travel overseas. With Covid and other religious regulations, their travels are dangerous. They have to pass through checkpoints with military and police, and are experiencing unexpected delays. Despite these occurrences, God is faithful to them. Pray for His wisdom in them as they travel.

We have new classroom doors! Thank you to the Safety team for advocating for outward opening doors for our two upstairs classrooms (Kids Zone and Discovery Zone). Thank you to Mike Furno and his team of contractors for making that happen! Also thank you to Mike and his team of volunteer painters for improving our entries and exits and especially for improving our new street side door on the Kids Zone. And a big thank you to Leonard O'Malley for dramatically brightening our Kid Zone landscaping. Our Preschool families love their new entry! Our downstairs classroom has a new door as well (installed by Mike's son-in-law), again thank you Mike!

We still have two large storage pods sitting outside that downstairs classroom that have been there since August 2020. It may not look like much has been happening with them, but the larger one has been completely emptied, cleaned and sanitized and is now slowly filling up with furniture and materials that will be brought into the classroom in the next few weeks when the work is completed.

The upstairs Teachers are very excited to have our downstairs materials that have been taking up space in their classrooms back where they belong. We are all looking forward to having the Preschool office, which has been taking up every extra corner of the Church office, put back together as well.

Even as things begin to settle down in the classrooms we continue to have changes in staffing. (We are still below the Early Childhood national average which has a 30% change in staffing each year.) We are all very sad to lose Teachers Anna and Sky but wish them well in their new pursuits. We are also so blessed to have Teacher Bonni return from her long Covid absence. The Teachers and children have been so excited to have her return! You can read Bonni's note in our Teachers Corner.

Please continue to keep the Preschool in prayer as we finish out our school year and transition into our summer program. We hope to have the details of our end of year program and summer registration finalized in the next few days. Please watch for the announcements!

In March Relief was sent to tornado victims in the southeast.

- Wells were dug in the Philippians, Kenya, and many other countries providing clean water for those who had none.
- At the end of March tornado relief was sent to Alabama and Georgia.
- Last year during the height of the pandemic field hospitals were sent to New York, Italy and the Bahamas providing many extra hospital beds for Covid victims.
- Samaritan's Purse workers in 24 countries trained 878,643 people in preventive measures in an effort to contain the pandemic. Also, 28,00 food baskets were given out and 119,700 people were presented with the gospel.
- Samaritan's Purse is equipping farmers in countries like South Sudan, Kenya, Cambodia, and Bolivia with seeds, tools, and training needed to help them yield a bountiful harvest.

As you can see, Samaritan's Purse is a lot more that just shoeboxes!
