A graveside service was held for beloved church member Jeanette Wright on October 30th, and a Celebration of Live Service was held for one of our original church members, Marge Luippold, on November 6th. May they all rest in peace!

Macedonia Missions to the Balkans/ANM Petre Petrov, Director

In January, a few of the churches continued with the Alpha course. This course is a welcoming outreach for people to come and hear God's Truth, and be able to ask questions about our faith.

A great need is for spiritual direction for pastor's children, and the new generation of young ministers. Only a few desire to serve the Lord and dedicate themselves tor some kind of church ministry.

Christmas services were celebrated on 1/7/22. God brought a lot of new people this year. The churches here do their own Christmas Boxes for children similar to ours through OCC. Almost every church invites 30-50 children with their parents to this evangelistic event. The children who participate are all invited to a Bible course comprised of 12 lessons. Pray for continued contact with new people and the children starting the Bible course.

Pray for provision and fruit for their ministries all over the Balkans, one of which is helping poor families with food packages. Along with the food, the Gospel and love of Jesus is shared.

The country was in political crisis for most of 2021. The prime minister resigned and a new vote took place recently. Pray for those God has chosen for government leadership to have wisdom and guidance for this country.

TCC sent a \$500.00 special donation to help the families who suffered the death of loved ones in the bus accident we reported about in the December newsletter. Pray that god will work through this tragic event!

Central Asian Family

J & H and family plan to return to their Asian country in March, to serve the people while living amongst them. They are grateful the door is still open for them to live there. Pray that God provides the necessary things for them to return; Visas and financial support.

Those they trained last November in Western Asia have taken the training home, and have begun applying it. J & H meet with them weekly over video calls. They look forward to reconnecting with them in person again when they return to Central Asia.

While stateside, J has been busy sharing the Gospel with neighbors and immigrant workers at the local grain elevator. (They helped work the family farm in N. Dakota) H connected with parents at parks, swimming pools, and other play dates. Good family discipleship was a high priority for them as well.

One of their new church members in North Dakoda was sent to prison. He sees it as an opportunity to reach the lost. He is treating it as a "mission trip" and is known there as the Bible guy. Recently he helped baptize a new brother in the faith. Praise God!

Tim & Susan Driscoll, Japan

Both of the Driscolls are back in Japan, praising God for health and provision!

Susan has been leading a virtual Pre-Home Assignment workshop with 16 participants. Pray that they are encouraged and well prepared for the time they are home in their sending countries. Pray that more people will respond to the call to work in Japan and East Asia when they hear from these workers.

Also, the Serve Asia workers still cannot get into Japan due to covid restrictions.

Pray for Yui to confidently confess Christ and walk faithfully with Him. Tim has been discipling her by Skype for some time now. Pray for continued good conversations, understanding, and conviction.

Tim & Susan will be on a 1 year Home Assignment in about 5 months. Pray for preparations and for those they will hand over their roles to. Pray that they finish this assignment well with strength and grace.

Life Choices Pregnancy Clinic North Carson, Nevada

The concerns of clients varies from; not sure they are pregnant, being abortion minded, and most of the time 'what am I going to do'. Pray for the advocate counselors as they come along side them, listen with compassion, share helpful options, offer to pray with them, and show them the love of Jesus.

Pray many will agree to have a free ultrasound. This usually means a return appointment so pray they will go back for the test. God uses ultrasound to reveal a heartbeat, a life, a baby!

Pray how they can offer "Abstinence Until Marriage" training which is used to reach students, especially right now with school restrictions. And parenting classes for young males and females who are expecting their first child.
