


The Pastor Search Committee is continuing its search for new candidates to consider for our next pastor.

Shoeboxes and a Lot More!

Our involvement with Samaritan's Purse is limited to Operation Christmas Child but they do a lot more than shoeboxes. I wanted to include two short excerpts from Franklin Graham's

newsletter because I thought they were relevant. The first part is about Tukey where the Stauffer's live, and the second part is about a milestone in Ukraine.

"Dear Friend, Massive earthquakes devasted central Turkey on February 6, killing thousands in collapsed buildings and leaving multitudes desperate for help. The first quake had a magnitude of 7.8 with an aftershock of 7.5 near the biblical city of Antioch. Sarmatian's Purse immediately airlifted one of our Emergency Field Hospitals to Turkey. As I write this, we are setting it up near Antioch, "where the disciples were first called Christians." (Acts 11:26)

Please lift up the people of turkey and neighboring Syria as they grieve and struggle to rebuild their homes and lives. Ask God to open doors for our ministry and to provide resources for our teams to save lives, relieve suffering, and share the hope of the Gospel of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

"I recently traveled to Ukraine and celebrated a milestone for Operation Christmas child-our 200 millionth shoebox gift. We praise God for powerful ways He continues to use these gifts in the midst of war to advance the Gospel of our Lord and Savior.

Despite the war, churches in Ukraine are planning to offer The Greatest Journey lessons for 120,000 children this year. Around the World, we are working to teach millions more.

Thank you for your prayers and support for the work of Samaritan's Purse as we work to meet emergency needs around the world in the Name of Jesus Christ. May God Bless You!"

April's letter, which is posted in the foyer contains wonderful stories about how God is using local churches to meet the peoples physical and spiritual feeds following the devastating earthquakes in Turkey. Some of the funding for these efforts comes from our church!

Here are some specific prayer requests for April:

April 1-8 Pray for the people of Pakistan as their country suffers under significant political, social, economic, food and energy cries that effect everyone. Pray that God will raise up Pakistani youth to evangelize their piers.

April 9-15 Praise God that many earthquake victims are now followers of Christ thanks to the church's relief efforts. Pray for the "Hope Stands" funding effort.

Central Asian Family Update Our Family is Growing!

Our adoption journey started on February 14th 2015. We were engaged to be married and excited about the adventures ahead. I, H, for Valentine's Day gave J a card. Inside the card was \$100 and a small note that wrote "let's start saving for adoption." We were married two months later and monthly put aside money to save for adoption. We started to pray for our future adopted child. In 2019, I was volunteering in an orphanage where we lived. That fall I had two very clear and vivid dreams about adopting one specific older boy in the orphanage. This boy has severe disabilities. He is unable to walk or use his arms. I told James about it and we started to pray and think about adopting this boy.

We both felt like it was not the right time because we were starting a business and that was our "baby." Then in the spring of 2022 we took a sabbatical rest and in that time felt the Lord telling us it was time to start pursuing adopting this specific boy. We were encouraged by Luke 14:12-14 in which Jesus says to invite the poor, the lame, the crippled and the blind into your banquet. We saw the Lord showing us that this is for this specific boy; through adoption we are inviting him into the banquet of our family. July 2022 we sent our application into Lifeline. And in August I had one more dream about this specific boy. In this dream he was older and adopted into our family.


Where are we now in the journey?

We have finished our home study and now we are in the waiting stage. We have used all of our adoption savings and now have applied to make an adoption account with an organization similar to "gofundme". It will take about a month to get approved for this. Please pray for all of our funds to come through. We can not start the next step in the process until we pay the next fee. Also pray about joining our adoption through giving financially. We will send out the tax-deductible link whenever our account application is approved and it is made available. If you would like to expedite our fund raising by giving directly to us through Venmo, or some other option, please let us know. We need \$3,562.50 in order for our home study to be given to the US government to process and give us approval.

We are adopting through Lifeline Children Services (a Christian organization). Thank you so much for praying and supporting our family in this new adventure.

Evidence of Noah's Flood

We interrupted the regularly scheduled Sunday School programming (in Acts) last week to show Bill Kolstad's latest evidence tour for the biblical timeline of the Genesis flood. After explaining why the lethal quantity of radon gas refutes the 20th century legend of geologic time, images of flood deposition were shown from the top of Carson Pass to the center of Nevada and as far away as Zion National Park, Utah.

A catastrophic global flood during human experience would deposit many layers of sediment on the continents and this is exactly what our state fossil park displays; giant marine creatures piled on the lee shore of sea water left standing in the Great Basin. This Ichthyosaur vertebrae is found in the top level of the surface strata suggesting it is the most recent deposition rather than tens, much less hundreds of millions of years ago.



Inside the Great Basin surface layers of flood deposition remain undisturbed like the vertebrae pictured, but just outside the basin the landscape is wildly different reflecting a catastrophic drainage also detailed in Genesis as occurring in only 150 days. This drainage is dramatized in the Colorado River "basin" which channeled this one time event washing out miles of freshly deposited sediment several miles wide in many areas between buttes and mesas whose level strata and flat tops testify to both catastrophic deposition as well as drainage. Pictured here is Hurricane Mesa just west of Zion National Park.



Public school curriculum strictly avoids any resources that make reference to such field evidence in favor of a macro evolutionary worldview, hence Bill's passion to lead small groups on local field trips to examine the evidence for biblical inerrancy.



Our Daily Bread

Many of you, like me, use and enjoy "Our Daly Bread" as a personal devotional. But I was unaware of the scope of their work. In Thailand, there

is a project called "Turn prison into Heaven" using Our Daily Bread Resources. The Thailand team has shared God's Word to more than 22,000 inmates and about 6,700 of them have decided to accept Jesus. 11,000 inmates have subscribed to receive copies of the Our Daily Bread special edition for inmates. I will share other Our Daly Bread programs in the future.
