Building and Grounds Update

Now that the snow has finally melted, we have assessed our damage and have

a tentative plan in place for repairs. We have bids out on repairing the roofs on the Worship Center and Fellowship Hall but have not heard back on them yet. All of the roofers in the area are extremely busy and we have to be patient.

The playground equipment survived the winter but the fences around both playgrounds have taken quite a beating. We will need to hire a fence company to repair those. We are looking at making a change to the upper playground. We would like to remove part of the fence on the hill side of the playground and put in a restraining wall to keep back the dirt and rocks. This will make it safer and look nicer. Mike Furno is in the process of pricing out the materials needed and we will probably tackle this project ourselves. We will let you know when manpower is needed.

Speaking of manpower, we held our first work day of the year on Saturday May 20th. Bill Kolstad, Leonard O'Malley, Bop Pavich, Mike Furno, Jerry Klosterboer and I worked hard all morning. We were able to accomplish a lot but this is a large property and there is still much to do.

We had a fire safety inspection recently and it was determined that we have to have two trees by the Kid's zone building trimmed up and one tree by the Office Parking Lot removed. We will contract this work out soon.

The ceiling tiles in the Discovery Zone Have been replaced and looks great. We still have ceiling work in the storage room in the front of the Worship Center to do but there is no hurry to get it done.

We have been blessed with a very large property which means we have a lot of maintenance and upkeep that has to be done on a regular basis. Please contact Leonard O'Malley or Mike Furno if you see anything that needs to be done or if you would like to volunteer to help fix things up.

Church Bylaw Amendments Approved

At our business meeting on May 21st, the church membership voted to

amend two articles of our bylaws.

Article 5 Section 8 Ministry Leader Requirements. has been amended to read as follows: "All ministry heads shall be required to be members. All others faithfully serving the church shall be encouraged to become members (James 3:1; Luke 12:48)." This amendment eliminates the requirement for all teachers to be church members.

Article VI Section 3 Nomination, Selection. and Tenure of Office, has been amended to read as follows: "Once an Elder candidate is being considered, the church shall publicly post the nominee approved by the Elders in alphabetical order at least three weeks prior to any regular or special meeting of the church members. All nominees are required to have been a member of the church for a minimum of (1) year at the time of nomination. At this meeting, the nominee shall be presented to the members to affirm or reject the decision of the Elders. If the nominee is affirmed by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of church members present, the newly affirmed Elders shall assume office immediately. There is no specific time limit for an Elder's service unless decided by quorum of Elders." This amendment allows the church to vote on affirming Elders at any church meeting throughout the year.

I will send out updated copies of the bylaws to all church members when completed.

Missions Ministry Chairperson

The elders are looking to call a Missions Ministry Chairperson in to ser-

vice. We have not had one since Carol Borsos left. This person would be responsible for coordinating all of our missions efforts including: suggesting which missions to fund and at what level, gathering and posting newsletters and other information from our various missions, corresponding with our missionaries, writing articles for the monthly church newsletter, and of course praying. Please contact the elders if you feel God leading you in this direction.

Elder Ordination



Bill Rowell and Bill Kolstad were both officially affirmed by the church membership to serve as Church Elders at the May 21st Business Meeting. In accordance with

our bylaws, both men have already assumed the office of Elder and are caring out duties and responsibilities as such.

The Church will conduct an ordination service for Bill and Bill at a later date to be determined.

Sunday Morning Liturgy

The term Liturgy simply means "Spiritual Practices" that pertains to the order of events of a church service. The Elders want to encourage our body to be more involved in worship so here are some of the practices that we either have or will be adding to the worship service..

1. Body Life: Someone sharing a ministry opportunity, a report on an event that has already taken place, or a need in the body.

We have been doing body life all along but we have not been calling it that. When Jacky does a VBS promo, that's body life. When Karen shares about the shoebox ministry, or when Kevin shares about AWANA, that's body life.

Body life will be included in the service as the need arises. We may do one several weeks in a row and then go several weeks without one.

- 2. Meet and Greet: The elders have decided to suspend the meet and greet during the service. We can still "meet and greet" each other and our visitors before and after the service and everyone is encouraged to do so!
- **3. Corporate Prayer:** A vocalized prayer led by the Service Elder, preacher, or staff member.

Corporate prayer can take on several forms. One way is for someone to pray for something on behalf of the Church. An example of this is what Kai has been doing before the worship set.

Another form is someone praying for specific prayer requests from the congregation. There are different ways of doing this also and the elders have not decided the approach they want to take yet.

4. Personal Testimony: A person's story of coming to faith, or a story about something God either did or is doing in a person's life. A good example of this is what the Campus Crusaders do each summer.

Testimonies will need to be screened and scheduled in advance. If anyone feels led to give a personal testimony, please talk to one of the elders.

5. Scripture Reading: Someone reading scripture that goes with the day's sermon. Readers will be selected in advance and given the scripture passage they are to read so that they can practice reciting it out loud.

It was a 12 day trip to the back areas of the indigenous Lencas Indians. We had 35 on the team including five doctors, three dentists, one chiropractor, and one surgeon. We worked in three different areas for two days each and saw a total of 1007 people.

Many of them never had any medical services because of the remote area in which they live. The local churches provided breakfast and lunch for us

which was cooked over wooden

stoves. There was no gas or electric in these areas. Church Family Missions is the group that organizes these trips and

they've been doing it for over 30 years.
