Pastor W. in Pakistan/FMI

Fifteen-year-old Fadumo lacked purpose and often wondered what would become of his life. His Muslim family crossed the border into Kenya from Somalia ten years ago to escape the violence of warlord rule there. But terrorism remained a threat even in their new homeland.

A few weeks ago, Fadumo was invited to a three-day Christian youth conference. Nothing like this has happened in his district before. The conference was sponsored by Christian pastor Jaali. "The first day we had 92 youth attend the gospel-themed conference. On the second and third day there were more than 100!." Several of them began a relationship with Jesus Christ during the conference. Fadumo was one of them.

Almost 40% of Kenyans are under the age of 15, so outreaches geared toward youth can have great gospel impact. In addition to pastoring his church plant which now has a little more than 200 people attending weekly, Jaali's ministry includes operating a school in his city of 22,000 residents.

FMI currently supports three church planters in the Kenyan countries bordering Somalia; our national leadership team would like to empower more partners in that region. While their ministries, like Jaali's are fruitful, there are many challenges. Muslims make up 98% of the population in theses countries and Christians are often discriminated against. Pray for the Lord's protection of His people here and for his provision of resources for expanded outreach.

Remember Me App

Are you looking for a tool to help you

memorize scripture? In his sermon on June 25th, Kevin Mayer talked about two of them, kind of old school, and new school.

The old school method is to print out cards that have a Bible verse on one side and the reference on the other. I personally have used memory cards and found them great! You can go online and get them premade or make them yourself. Keven passed out one sheet of the verses that the AWANA Kids are learning on Sunday to get you started. I have copies in the office if you did not get one.

We are not endorsing any particular organization, but the Navigators Ministry, similar to CRU, has a really comprehensive collection of theses cards called "The Topical Memory System." As the name indicates, all Bible verses are organized by topics to help you remember the versus you are memorizing.

On the new school side, you can now download Apps onto your phone or other devices that read versus to you outloud. There are several different apps of this type available but the one Keven talked about was Remember Me Bible app by Poimena.

Remember Me reads and repeats verses so that you can listen to them while you are driving or while exercising. It works on the Web, iPhone or Android and they all update your account so if you make changes in one it updates the others.

Versus are subcategorized by **New**, **Due** (versus you are working on) and **Known** (versus you have memorized.) Kevin provided step by step instructions on how to use the Remember Me app. I have copies of those in the office as well.

No matter what method you choose, Memory Verse cards (Old School) , or the Remember Me App (New School), Bible memory is encouraged for everyone!

If you run across, or know of, an App or Bible memory method you like that is not mentioned in this article, please share it with us. We would love to hear about it!

Operation Heal Our Patriots A Ministry of Samaritan's Purse

Marine Lance Corporal PJ Kehs returned from one of the bloodiest battles in the Iraq War as a shell of the man he had once been. Several combat buddies had died, and he couldn't understand why he survived and they did not. Anger consumed him, and he formed "a heart of rock," he said. His coldness and hair-trigger reactions to the most mundane things soon began straining his marriage.

PJ and his wife, Chelsea, attended the first week of Operation Heal Our Patriots this year at Samaritan Lodge Alaska in an effort to restore their broken marriage. There, PJ learned to let go of his anger, and he and Chelsea accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior. At week's end, they were baptized together.

For 17 weeks during the Operation Heal Our Patriots summer season, we fly up to 11 couples to Alaska for Biblically based marriage enrichment. Many of them come to know Jesus and are baptized. Many also rededicate their marriages to one another and to God.

PJ and Chelsea's transformation wouldn't have been possible without the support of generous partners like you. Will you help us continue to introduce couples like them to the Savior and find the healing they need?

First Fruits An Update from the Central Asian Family

"I did not go out looking for Christianity. I went out looking for the truth. And it happens to be Christianity"

Our new sister in Chrlst said the above quote to her friends who have been harassing her for leaving Islam. It has been a very exciting and fruitful season. Several months ago I (H) shared the good news at a store with the seller. She told me "you are the third person who has shared this message with me in the last few months. This must be a sign from God. I want to learn more." (!) Unbeknownst to me (H), three others from our ch-rch network had shared the good news with her independently and God in his kindness to me allowed me to be the harvester! She is now daily reading the Word and studying. She is sharing with her friends and coworkers and desires to get dunked. Please pray for A* to get dunked soon. Pray also for her children and for her family to believe.

Redemptive Agriculture

Why Focus on Agriculture?

We live in a "creative-access country." Which means in order to live and minister here long term we have to be creative with work and business so we can get a visa. Thank you for your patience and prayers, as we seek to love God and love people in the place we live. There are so many complex decisions involved in living where we do, and we need the Lord's wisdom!!

In the powerful book, When Helping Hurts, the authors offer their perspectives on how one can "alleviate poverty without hurting the poor...and yourself." They highlight the four key relationships that God designed us to have: relationship with God, with self, with others, and with the rest of creation. Brokenness in these relationships is the underlying cause of poverty. "If we treat only the symptoms or if we misdiagnose the underlying problem, we will not improve their situation, and we might actually make their lives worse." (p. 54)

I (J) want to bring redemption to people's four key relationships, simultaneously, not sequentially. I'm sensing that the most natural, and effective way for me to do this work is through a farm.

Short-term Goals & their progress!

Learn best practices from farmers around the world

God's provided at least 15 neighbors here, and many more around the world, who are passionate about Jesus & agriculture and who've helped guide me during this research & vision forming stage.

Begin Farming

Construction: In partnership with local young men who are interested in agriculture, we built 1 greenhouse, 1 chicken brooder, and 3 mobile chicken coops (see picture below)

Land: A neighbor provided land (for free!) for us to place 10 bee hives, and to raise 150 meat chickens. Finances: Gifts and personal funds helped us cover all our expenses!

Products:

Just last week we butchered our chickens, and the taste of their meat is fantastic!!

The rabbit mothers have had 4 litters of bunnies, but they sadly haven't been able to keep them alive.
All 10 hives of bees are still alive and the bee colonies are all healthy.

Deep Relationships!! "I didn't understand the farming ideas you were sharing before, but now I do! This is such a wonderful idea! I took pictures and I will share with my relatives about it!" These comments came from my neighbor who I brought to see our chickens in mobile coops. This is someone who I share Biblical stories with regularly, but who for now remains far from God.

Long-term goals

- Develop a clear business plan
- Purchase ideal land to further develop our farm, where we can research best practices, and model them for others
- Start a youth club (possibly "Future Farmers of Kyrgyzstan") to begin developing the next generation of leaders
- Please pray for us as we decide how to proceed forward!

Adoption

Our adoption is still in process. Please pray for all the funds to come in and for favor with all the documents and governments we will be interacting with. Currently Given: \$6,750 of 30,530

Partners in Prayer We've created a group in the Signal phone app where we can share more frequent and specific prayer requests. So far we have 2 of the 100 partners we're praying for. Let us know if you'd be willing to partner with us in this way!

Here are a few facts: 18 cities and 524 towns in Japan are without a church. 1 out of 8 Protestant Churches have no pastor. The main religions are Shinto and Buddhism. Less than 1% of the population are Christians.
