VBS runs for 5 days with a closing program and barbecue for the families on Friday afternoon.



When Kai first came here in August 2016, it wasn't to play music, he came as a volunteer for the food pantry. Bob Daly found out that Kai played guitar and since I was the worship leader at the time, Bob introduced us. I was skeptical at first because I have known a lot of people who said they could play an instrument but really couldn't Well, it turned out that Kai was a great player and started playing with the praise team right away. Kai's wife Katie and two daughters Kyra and Kaylena started coming to worship with us about the same time.

If you look back, you can really see God at work. Kai came to us right after Jim Brocket went to be with the Lord. We had Pastor Paul on piano, but we needed a guitarist and a base player. It was only a few months after Kai joined us that pastor Paul moved on to Sacramento. So, that left just Kai, me on drums, and about four vocalists. Kai told me that Kyra played piano, and Kaylena played bass. He actually said they played a little and asked if it would be OK for them to join the team. Again, I was skeptical and proven wrong.

While Kyra did not play too much piano at first, she was an incredibly fast learner and learned more in six months than most people do in years. Kaylena was a good player from the start but turned into a great player. Without a doubt, Kaylena is one of the finest bass players I have every had the pleasure of playing with!

When my time as worship leader was up, Allie Jones took over and the Keith family continued on. And boy did they work well together. The worship music they produced was incredible.

When Alli left in January of 2021, Kai took over as Worship Leader and continued to produce exceptional worship music.

And let's not forget Katie. Katie jumped in right away as well serving as audio technician, video technician, and recorded the sermons every Sunday.

Besides the music, the Kieth family was also involved in VBS, women's events, shoebox packing parties, and a lot more.

Tim and Susan Driscoll, Japan (OMF)

Tim and Susan's August newsletter was titled "Tongue, Travels and Transcendence." Susan had just returned from a ten day "Prayer Journey" across the main Island of Japan and she recorded some of her thoughts and prayer requests. Here are two:

"I was blessed to see our OMF workers in their place of ministry. I was spurred on by their faithfulness in small, hard places with sometimes little results of their efforts in outreach and evangelism; yet their vision and passion remains, fueled on by our faithful God who is building His church."

"In August, the Japanize celebrate a festival called Obon. This year we really felt the heaviness of the festival, physically, emotionally and spiritually. What a good reminder that our fight is not against flesh and blood, but against spiritual powers of darkness in high places. Please be praying for us to stand firm and faithful when the evil one attacks. Pray for God's hedge of protection around us, our family and our Ministry."

Central Asian Family

I have not heard from the Central Asian Family in a while. The latest information I have is the flyer in the foyer and items posted on the bulletin board. I will certainly pass on more information as I receive it.

Pastor W. in Pakistan/FMI

I just posted the latest newsletter from FMI on the bulletin board. It contains a very touching story of one family's conversion to Christianity and their struggle to survive in a hostile environment.

Here are short versions of a few prayer requests:

- September 2-9 Pray for peace in FMI's partner countries, especially Turkiye and Pakistan. Pray that Christians in theses countries reflect the love of God to those on all sides of the conflicts.
- September 10-16 Thank God for his provision of a motorcycle for Pastor Pratapgarh who ministers across multiple tribal villages. Pratapharh requests prayers as he often experiences barriers and persecution when trying to share the Gospel.

September 17-23 Uphold Pastor Utku and his church. They have lost their lease and are in need of a different place to meet and worship. They currently have only 40% of the funds needed to move.

Macedonia Missions to the Balkans/ANM: Marino Mojtic and the Evangelical Church of Macedonia"

I thought letter from ANM was especially encouraging this month.

"It is often said: children are the future. Did you know that is true in missions too? The Native Missions you support are reaching today's children with the Gospel so they can become tomorrow's Christian leaders and missionaries. Here is the testimony of a young girl named Mint, who was brought up in a Christian children's home run by ANM missionaries in Thailand.

"When I first came to the children's home, I was in grade one. I did not know God. I thought that God was not real. But as I stayed here, God has taught me a lot, to have love and joy. I thank the Lord that He watches over me.

Mint did not know the Lord at all, and now she is a small group leader and worship leader for the younger kids at the home! Your support helps children like Mint learn about Jesus and receive a good education along with the loving care every child should have."

This letter and the newsletter from the Evangelical church in Macedonia are posted on the bulletin board.
