There are still lots of empty shoeboxes for you to take home and fill up. The table in the foyer has all the information you will need to participate in this years shoebox drive. Our goal this year is 441 boxes. (Last year we collected 440) We already have 50 boxes turned in, plus what we will packing at the packing party gets us off to a great start.

Our annual shoebox packing party is scheduled for Saturday November 11th starting at 1:30 pm in Fellowship Hall. We will be packing 307 Gospel Opportunity Boxes. Last year we did 300. Please let me know if you will be available to attend.

If you are unable to attend the packing party, there are other ways that you can participate in the shoe box drive. The best way is to pack your own boxes and bring them in before Dedication Sunday on November 12th. We will be praying over the boxes before hey get shipped off to the warehouse and then around the world!

You can also help with a monetary gift. You can donate \$15.00 to cover the cost of filling a box or \$10.00 per box to cover the shipping cost.

God has done amazing things through these boxes in the past and we can trust Him to do amazing things in the future!

Here are excerpts from a letter I received from the Children's Hunger Fund:


"Thank you for choosing Children's Hunger Fund for your 2023 VBS Mission Moment during "Keepers of the Kingdom!"

### A Shoe Box Story

Karen Beverage Since our shoeboxes have gone to Mexico these past two years, I wanted to choose a story from there. There were many great stories but this was the best one I found.

#### Mexico: An Alcoholic Father Changed

One of the families that accepted Jesus was the Uriarte Diaz family, where Jafet (8 years old) lives. It was a broken home because the father was an alcoholic. When the teacher gave us the names of all the children that were invited to the OCC event, we prayed for all of them and for their families. This family came and when the call to accept Jesus in their hearts was given, this family was the first one to come forward. The father was crying and hugged his wife and children asking them for forgiveness. Jafet said he had never received a gift before but that the best gift was to see his father hugging them and attending church, and that he wasn't drinking on that day.

We followed up with this family and Jafet told us there is peace in his home and the whole family still comes to church. The teachers give glory to God and thank Samaritan's Purse for being the tool God used to save many lives and give joy to many children.

I really liked this story because it really emphases how the shoe boxes affect not only the kids but entire families, and in some case entire communities!

Here is the 2023 Mid-Year report from FMI: "Your support of Pastor W. during the first half of 2023 encouraged him and his church members for new avenues of ministry among their Muslim neighbors across 5 different ministry sites. The average combined weekly attendance of these congregations is now more that 240 people. From January through June, Pastor W. was privileged to lead 72 people to faith in Jesus Christ and baptized 3 of them. He also trained 54 church members for evangelism and they, in turn, were delighted to lead 79 people to faith in Christ. Please keep praying for Pastor W. and the people in his congregations.

(From our Central Asian Family

"We were encouraged by Luke 14:12-14 in which Jesus says to invite the poor, the lame, the crippled and the blind into your banquet. We saw the Lord showing us that this is for this specific boy; through adoption we are inviting him into the banquet of our family. The events of the last two years also remind us that Jesus may return any day, and we agreed we would feel sad if Jesus returned before we'd adopted one of the unnumbered plethora of orphaned children with special needs, suffering greatly throughout the world. In July 2022 we sent our application into Lifeline, and in August I had one more dream about this specific boy. In this dream he was older and adopted into our family.

I am doing a happy dance of celebration this morning! We got USCIS approval!! Which means we are temporarily done dealing with the US government and all be sent to Kyrgyzstan! Wahoo!

Prayers once again for quick processing of our dossier. Once we are registered with the ministry we will get our referral for the boy we are pursuing to adopt! "
