The Shepherds Spotlight

WHEN NO ONE IS LOOKING

"Whoever walks in integrity

walks securely, but he who makes his ways crooked will be found out" (Proverbs 10:9).

The testimony of a local church is interrelated and expressed by her individual members and their commitment to being men and women of godly integrity. Someone has well said that the 'true you' is when no one is looking.

Allow me to illustrate the link between integrity and trust. A story is told of a Georgia high school basketball coach named George Stroud.

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Home School Co-op Update

The Tahoe Community Church Home School Co-op (TCCHC) has switched lead-

ership from Kevin Mayer to the parents themselves. The two leaders of the Co-op are Liz Higgins (from our Church) and Jodie Nelson (from Sierra Community Church). Kevin is still highly involved teaching math and assisting with the administration of the program. Elder Oversight is provided by Bob Daly and Bill Kolstad. The Church Office contact is Ted Beverage.

I am impressed the structure of the Co-op. They have developed a policy manual that all participating families must sign and agree to. The whole program is Biblically sound and God centered. This is from their "Who We Are" statement: "TCCHC exists to provide a supportive and encouraging community for homeschooling families as they pursue academic excellence and raising their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4)

Parents and tutors are asked to sign and declare they agree with TCCHC's statement of faith in order to join the TCCHC Co-op, this ensures they agree on the basics of our Christian faith. Parents and tutors are also background checked by the Church. This is not a drop-off program. Parents are expected/needed to serve. Parents are always responsible for their children while on church property and parents are also responsible for all supplies for their students.

The curriculum section of the Policy Manual states that parents have full responsibility for the education of their kids. It also says that "each tutor is required to tutor in accordance with scripture and with the practices and beliefs of Tahoe Community Church." Classes include Math, English, Reading, Latin for the older kids, and Science. The curriculum used is Claritas. There are currently 10 families with over 22 kids in the Co-op.

Their day begins with prayer in the Sanctuary. What a great way to start! The students are then divided into three age groups for two one-hour classes. Lunch/recesses takes place at noon followed by two more one-hour classes in the afternoon.

opinion, this is a ministry that is well conceived, well run, and an asset for Tahoe Community Church.

In 1987 Coach Stroud, who had been a successful coach in 20+ years as a high school basketball coach, for the first time won the Georgia State

championship. However, a few days after the championship game Coach Stroud discovered that one of his players had become academically ineligible during the course of the season.

This particular player was not a starter. In fact the academically ineligible player was not even one of his better reserves. But during one of their playoff games, when the score was not in doubt, Coach Stroud played all of his reserves, including this one player. Again, the player did not effect the outcome of the game...in fact, he didn't even score any points.

So Coach Stroud found himself facing an ethical conundrum. Does he tell his team of this infraction of the Georgia State Athletic Association—bringing disappointment to a successful, championship season? Or does he keep the matter to himself, rationalizing that surely no state official knew of the infraction and possibly no players knew of the rules violation either?

Coach Stroud didn't hesitate. He contacted state competition officials and informed them of the rules violation—forfeiting his team's only Georgia State high school basketball championship. When asked why he did it, Coach Stroud replied with what he told his team, "People forget about basketball scores and championships, but they never forget what you are made of..."

Well, the citizen voters of Rockdale County didn't forget what Coach George Stroud was made of...a few years after he got out of coaching, he was twice elected as Rockdale County Supervisor.

Character is not measured when life's circumstances are easy. Character shines brightest when it chooses the harder right instead of the easier wrong. For Reflection: in your personal or professional relationships, are you known for being a person of integrity? Do you give in to easy short cuts when no one is looking? Or do others view you as 'above reproach' (1 Timothy 3:2) because they have observed your godly character on display?

May TCC be known as a community of Christfollowers who are men and women of superior integrity!

Building and Grounds



There were two large projects completed since the last newsletter. The first was the construction of two new play structures. The first one is located on the upper playground. It has only been up for two weeks and has already been tested and enjoyed by the Homeschool Co-op kids (Pictured above) and the AWANA kids.

There is a second play structure located between the Worship Center and the Church Office. This one (Pictured Below) features a unique swing. The kids stand on it and ride it like a skate board. There is also a punching bag and a basketball hoop. Both of these structures were donated to the church, and they were assemble by Bob Daly.

The second large project was replacing the hot water heater in the Discovery Zone building. When the new sink was installed it was discovered that there was no hot water. The hot water in the bathroom had been working fine up to that point, at least as far as we know. This is why it is so important to report any problems that you come across. We can not fix a problem we do not know about.

Two other projects completed were fixing the heat tape on the back of the Worship Center that



got damaged last winter and cleaning the carpet in Fellowship Hall. I didn't realize how bad the carpet was until we removed all the tables and chairs. Now it looks like new again! The carpets in the Office and in the Discovery Zone are scheduled to be cleaned on October 10th.



VBS Kids are "Fantastic Fundraisers"

At VBS this year the kids went on "The Good News Cruise" every-

day and learned about missions. Their project for the week was to collect coins for The Children's Hunger Fund. The kids raised \$633 which was enough to provide 2,532 meals and to share the gospel with children in need. Their efforts earned them the designation "Fantastic Fundraisers" A certificate received and a thank you letter from the Children's Hunger Fund are posted on the bulletin board. Well done VBS kids!

We live in a village outside of the city. Many people have been suspicious of us. Confused why we would leave the comforts of America to live here. So they make up stories and aossip circulates. We even found out someone watches with their binoculars from their bedroom as J walks around our village. So what do we do with all the suspicion? We smile. We pick up trash. We invite people to dinner. We start an English Kids club. Of course the main reason for the Kids Club is to build gospel bridges into lives. But another really practical reason is to open the doors to our home and let people come and check us out. And check us out they have. We have people even come and video tape our home from their phones. (You know when they are trying to be stealth about it but it is very obvious what they are doing!)

Anyways, the English Club has opened up relationships with many kids and families. My heart goes out to the children as I have gotten to know their lives. Another boy watched his friend drown in the river by our village last summer and was blamed for it.

Another girl's father is abusive. My heart is pricked by the weight these children have to grow up under. And if all this wasn't enough, they bear the yoke of Islam. I often tell the children "God loves you." And I have been able to share my testimony with some of the older kids.

Please pray for our village which is called Rocks Father. Pray for these children to find the Rock of Christ as their true Father. We finished the summer with a pool and pizza party. Was so fun just to live in these kids.

Big Changes We have an Exciting Announcement!!

J has started working as a fourth grade school teacher at an international school in Bishkek. I know a bunch of questions and maybe even confusion just synapsed in your brains, so here's why!

- Visa! Visa! Visa! The issue of needing a visa each year has been very stressful. J is under much scrutiny each time we have to renew. This gives us an easy visa.
- Seeking better fit for emotional health (Stress, anxiety and even depression has plagued us as we have tried to succeed in business in a corrupt country).
- More consistent ministry times and family time
- Access to English speaking Kyrgyz community.
- Able to stay in country longer as we wait for our adoption to finalize and for D to come home. (We were going to have to leave country in January but now we can stay longer)

In the end of August, J was offered a teaching position at Bright International School. Our immediate response was to decline, but as we prayed and sought out wise counsel it seemed like God was lining up this new chapter for us. J is almost a month into this new job and seeing his emotional health at a better place as well as seeing many opportunities to be a Light. His colleagues are from all over the world-lran, Pakistan, India, Philippines, Europe, Africa. His students are like sheep without a shepherd. Unfortunately many of the parents are absent from their kids lives and J has been surprised by how open the kids are about struggles. Please pray for J's colleagues and students to know Jesus.

What about Renew Farms?!

J's business manager Brother B is going to continue Renew Farms. He is an excellent farmer

and very passionate about doing his work with excellence. J will continue to help and train B for the next two months. We are very thankful that this project will continue forward. Keep Brother B in your prayers as he wants this business to be a Light in the darkness.

A Shoe Box Story

Argentina: My children received the boxes

I greet you all in the name of the Lord. My children received the boxes you prepared and we want to give you

thanks for them. My husband, children and I are working in the work of the Lord. In 1986 we began working for the Word of Life in Buenos Aires for 41/2 years preparing to serve the Lord. We were invited to work in the Province of Mendoza. We worked the fields there for nine years. We worked on a program with 60 poor children who in the past years we were able to give them a glass of milk before school. Many of them would go without eating breakfast because their parents couldn't buy them milk or bread, or their parents didn't feed them because they left very early to work the fields planting garlic, onions or potatoes. Thanks to God these children also received the boxes and gifts and were very happy.

As workers in the field of service of our Lord we do not have money for gifts for our own children at Christmas. The boxes you send were the only gifts our children received. The truth is many times my children ask me for things like ice cream, a bike, or pants and I cannot buy them for them. We received \$50.00 a month. You all probably wonder how a family of 4 can live on this. I tell you the Lord always provides. In the town where we lived there was a woman who sold used clothing. We would get just what we need. At times we would see what we needed, there but we wouldn't have the money, so we would pray silently that Lord if you think we need this, keep it until we can buy it. He would help us see if we really needed it.

My children Luciana, now 15, Maxi 14, and April 2. I could see the joy in their faces when they opened their boxes as it socks, story books, things for the hair, toys etc. Some very simple but for them these things were very beautiful. That's why I want to thank you for your gifts. We are now living in the south of the country in order to work at a mission and evangelize again. The place is called Comodona Nevadavia in the province of Chubut. I hope some day we will be able to meet, it not here, in heaven together with our loving God. May God Bless you. A mother/sister in Christ.

Wow! I love these stories! Our shoebox drive kicks off is on October 13th. Karen will have the table ready with all the information you will need to pack

lots of wonderful boxes! We will also show a video to start things off on the right foot.

Our Shoe Box Packing Party is scheduled for Saturday November 9th which is one week earlier that normal. We will be packing 315 boxes! The goal for our church this year is 427 boxes.

Now is the time to start praying about how many boxes you can pack and for the all the children who will be receiving the boxes!



Ten Prayers for Schools

percent of their year at school? If we want to pray for our kids, then it's important to include prayers for their schools as well. According to 1 Timothy 2:1, God wants us to pray for all people, and that includes the public schools in our communities. Consider these prayers and the relevant Scriptures to ignite your prayers for the schools in your local community.

1. Love

Scripture: "'By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another'" <u>John 13:35 (NIV)</u>. **Prayer:** Father, may the students and staff of this school experience Your love through the Christians they know in profound and authentic ways.

2. Truth

Scripture: "Buy the truth and do not sell it—wisdom, instruction and insight as well" <u>Proverbs 23:23 (NIV)</u>. **Prayer:** Lord, release truth in this school. Help students to rightly discern truth from falsehood.

3. Principal and School Board

Scripture: "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God" <u>Romans 13:1 (NIV)</u>. **Prayer:** I pray blessings on the principal and each school board member (try to pray for them by name).

Father, may Your will be done at their meetings.

4. Teachers

Scripture: "For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding" Proverbs 2:6
Prayer: May (name of teacher) recognize the Godgiven responsibility he/she has for the best interests of the children they teach. May (name of teacher) walk in wisdom, integrity, kindness, grace, and truth.
